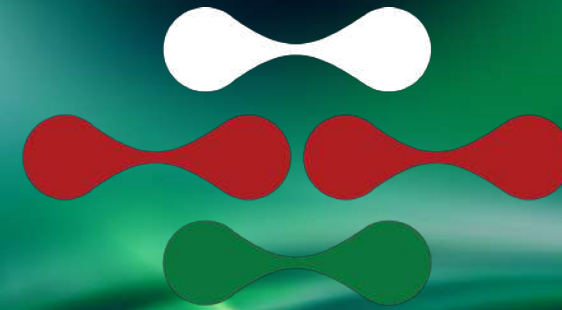

Expected Outcomes

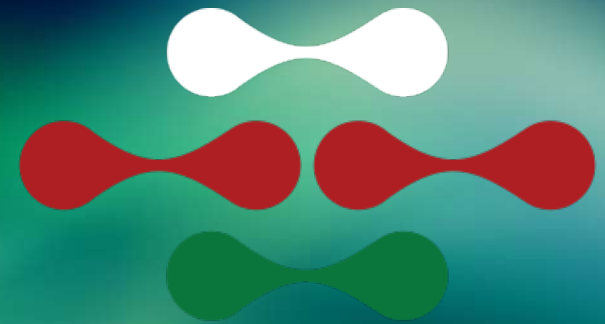
The forum is expected to:
